We are pleased to participate in the new Green Ways to School Campaign from Transportation Authority of Marin's Safe Routes to Schools program. This is our opportunity to reduce car trips to and from schools thus reducing the related greenhouse gases and traffic congestion in our community. Sign up for SchoolPool TripSharing Service

We encourage families to register on line to join a SchoolPool – carpool, walk, bike, or take the bus together to school with other families. It's easy and quick to register and participate. SchoolPool Early Bird Challenge

Marin County schools are challenged to reduce car trips to schools. The school with the highest percentage of families signed up for a SchoolPool TripSharing match list by October 15, 2010 will win the Early Bird prize of \$500 donated by Kaiser Permanente. Our School Community Adults Can Participate

Faculty, staff and parents at our school can participate too by going to the SchoolPool system which will connect them to 511 rideshare to find carpools or bike buddies to their work. Their trip reductions will count in the Green Ways to School Challenges for our school, they will be modeling green travel habits to the kids, and they are eligible for many incentives on 511 rideshare.
