Marin County School Access Safety Action Plan Update (Jen Shriber)

Jen presented an update on the Marin County School Access Safety Action Plan. The project, which began last summer and will continue through the year, involves developing a data-driven safety action plan focused on improving road safety around schools for children walking and biking. Jen highlighted key findings from the county-wide safety analysis, including trends in crashes involving youth active transportation users and the factors contributing to these crashes. She also discussed work to develop the draft high injury network and school travel priority locations, which will be further discussed at the next task force meeting. The project team aims to finalize these items and conduct safety audits in collaboration with the school community and task forces.

Corridor Priority Projects (Wendi Kallins)

The group discussed safety concerns around schools and intersections in Sausalito and Marin City. They agreed to prioritize a walk audit of a pathway through the corporation yard, as well as safety improvements around the new MLK campus and the Gate 5 intersection with Bridgeway. Kieran and Andrew were tasked with mapping out the areas for the walk audit, with the goal of completing it before the spring meeting.

Vision Zero (Sahar Shirazi)

Sahar explained that the county's Vision Zero Action Plan is a next step from the countywide Local Road Safety Plan and will identify specific countermeasures for prioritized locations in unincorporated Marin based on data analysis. The [project website](#) includes more information and a map-based survey where respondents can



identify safety issues and areas of concern. While the plan is just for unincorporated Marin, Sahar noted that the County will share all information with local jurisdictions. A community meeting will be held in the next few months.

Education and Encouragement (Gwen Froh)

Safe Routes is currently in discussion with MLK to hold education classes in the spring.

The group noted that Kieran runs a popular weekly bike train on Fridays. The team is looking to pull another parent, Doug, in as a welcome table volunteer. Gwen noted that events could be moved to a different day of the week to accommodate volunteers' schedules.

Gwen described the upcoming parent volunteer meeting on February 12. She mentioned that supplies for the second semester are being ordered and distributed, with the theme focused on Jane Goodall's work. Other upcoming events include the first Walk & Roll Wednesday on February 4 and National Walk and Bike to School Day on May 6.

City Updates (Andrew Davidson)

Andrew gave an update on two ongoing projects in Sausalito. Design on the Coloma and Ebbtide project has restarted after several years. The project will include installation of a sidewalk on the north side of Coloma from Bridgeway to Olema with a mid-block crossing as well as improvements to drop-off location at the New Village School along Ebbtide. The mid-block crossing on Coloma could be raised or include in-ground lights. Ebbtide improvements will feature two raised crosswalks and replacement of the painted median with a raised median. A public meeting will be held February 26 at City Hall: notices to nearby residents will be sent as well as advertising in the City's e-newsletter.

The Bridgeway safety improvements from Napa to Johnson are almost complete. The contractors are currently waiting for warmer weather to finish the striping and stamped asphalt. The project features pedestrian refuge islands, bulb-outs, rectangular rapid flashing beacons, improved striping and bike markings, and crosswalk consolidation.

Next Steps

- The Marin County School Access Safety Action Plan team will finalize its High Injury Network and priority areas and will report back in the spring.
- Wendi will follow up with Kieran and Andrew to map out and schedule a walk audit
- Safe Routes will look for an additional MLK volunteer if needed.
- The group will consider Marin City safe routes to bus stops at a future meeting
