Marin County School Access Safety Action Plan Update (Jen Shriber & Sharanya Varma)

Jen and Sharanya shared an update on the Marin County School Access Safety Action Plan project, including West Marin-specific crash analysis results. Almost 600 reported crashes occurred near West Marin schools from 2015-2024. This included 46 crashes involving active transportation users, including five youth bicyclists. Several locations were identified as part of the county's High Injury Network (HIN). Given the relatively low numbers of crashes compared to other HIN locations, and spread-out nature of schools, no West Marin HIN locations were identified as priority locations. The Safety Action Plan's safety toolkit will provide general safety strategies, engineering treatments, and programmatic tools for the town to use to improve road user safety near schools.

Corridor Planning (Wendi Kallins)

Wendi noted that a corridor plan is under development for the Point Reyes Station area. In the future, Safe Routes may consider ways to improve the San Geronimo Sir Francis Drake Boulevard crossing at Sage Lane and the entrance to the school children's path.

Safe Routes Spring Activities (Gwen Froh)

West Marin schools are participating in National Bike to School Day tomorrow. Nominations are open for the Bike hero award, which recognizes good "roll" models. Nominations will be



reviewed on May 25, and schools will be notified about the nominees and winners. Nominate a bike hero [here](#).

Safe Routes finished its education classes for the year, including a bike rodeo that offered bikes for students to use.

Crossing Guard Program Updates (Molly Graham)

TAM's crossing guard program is funded by Marin's half-cent sales tax, with funding increasing from 4.2% to 7.5% to support more guards. A data-driven, four-year cycle uses intersection monitoring and scoring (volume, speed, accident history) to rank locations; locations throughout the county were recently evaluated as part of the next four-year cycle. West Marin will gain two guards in addition to keeping its current guard in Lagunitas. The new guards will be located on Shoreline Highway in front of West Marin School and on Olema-Bolinas Road in front of the school

TAM will perform outreach in spring and summer to update the community about changes. Safe Routes will update suggested route to school maps prior to the fall semester, when changes will go into effect.

Bolinas Mapping Workshop (Wendi Kallins)

A mapping workshop will be held on May 19 at 5 PM at the Bolinas School. Once a suggested route map is created, Safe Routes can start considering improvements on Mesa Road.

Other

Wendi announced that this will be the last West Marin task force meeting for her and Gwen, who are both retiring at the end of the current school year. MCBC is actively recruiting Gwen's replacement, while Jen Shriber and David Hoffman will take over running the task forces. Jen has been working on Marin's Safe Routes to Schools program for almost six years. David is a former advocate and Fairfax resident with a deep knowledge of Safe Routes and Marin issues. Molly confirmed TAM's continued oversight and funding for the Safe Routes program, including the task forces.

Next Steps

- Parametrix will develop a corridor plan for Point Reyes
- In the future, Safe Routes will consider improvements at the San Geronimo crossing farmstand crossing.
- The Bolinas mapping workshop will be held on May 19 at 5 PM at Bolinas School.
